

FIRE & SMOKE DAMAGE REFRESHER

Dealing with fire and smoke damage jobs require both technical abilities and procedures but also a customer service component to ensure a satisfied customer. Both are important to build a list of satisfied customers or tenants within your company.

We will spend time on discussing the principals of a fire & smoke damage and how to restore the property to its pre-loss condition. An overview of how to restore and deodorize contents & structural damage and how to deal with soot residue.

We will also discuss different restoration techniques including ultrasonics, ozone, Hydroxyl, Thermal and ULV Foggers, etc. We will look at some of the obstacles that can hinder removal of smoke odours, such as not dealing with the source removal properly or performing work such as proper HVAC cleaning, etc.
