Over the years the increase of incidences involving active shooters, gang warfare and other illegal activities have meant a proliferation of grow-ops and meth labs. This has had an impact both on insurance carriers and insureds along with residential and commercial property managers and owners. It has created the need to become familiar with what they may be facing when they become involved in these types of claims. There are so many variables.

Sometimes the aftermath will be localized but more often, we are seeing it impact larger or surrounding buildings including commercial, institutional, and residential properties. Often we find that crime and violence are closely linked so when called in to do a trauma scene clean-up we may find grow-ops, meth labs and other clandestine situations.
